Nominating Committee accomplishments since November 1, 2019

4. Is distilling results of interviews with 3 former Board members into recommendations for the Board and recommendations for the Nominating Committee.

3. Continue to engage fellowship via WSO communications
4. Evaluate feedback from former Trustees and incorporate recommendations as appropriate
